ORDER VACATING SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION ORDER

On June 24, 1952, Schedule No. G-2, Channels for Farmer Lines, together with Table of Contents, being Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 1833-T to 1837-T, inclusive, of Citizens Utilities Company of California, filed under Advice Letter No. 99, was suspended until November 4, 1952 and on October 21, 1952 was further suspended until May 1, 1953. Said filing added an additional tariff which will be applicable to a service presently being provided to Mr. Raymond H. Berry, the request for suspension having been made by Edward M. Berol, attorney for Mr. Berry.

Under date of March 6, 1953 Mr. Berol addressed a letter to the Commission stating:

"The above-entitled and numbered matter is set for hearing March 13, 1953. We have reached certain agreements with counsel for Citizens Utilities Company which will dispose of this issue. Hence, our request for suspension of the involved schedule is hereby withdrawn.

"It is respectfully requested that the hearing be canceled and the proceeding be discontinued."

Accordingly, on March 9, 1953 the scheduled hearing was removed from the Commission's calendar. Inasmuch as the cause

for suspension has been removed, the suspension order of October 21, 1952 is vacated and set aside and this proceeding is discontinued and the suspension lifted as of April 1, 1953.
