OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, as amended, Pacific Electric Railway Company seeks authority to make an immediate interim increase in its interurban fares and to make more extensive fare adjustments subsequently. Following public hearings held before Commissioner Potter and Examiner Bryant the interim phase was taken under submission on December 4, 1952. Further evidence on the "final" phase was to have been received at an adjourned hearing on March 11, 1953. On the latter date Pacific Electric Railway Company moved that the interim phase be reopened to receive certain additional evidence, and that hearings on the "final" phase be postponed. The additional evidence on the interim phase was then received subject to the granting of the motion by the Commission. The motion was not opposed.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the submission of this proceeding on the request for interim relief is set aside and vacated, the evidence so offered by Pacific Electric Railway Company is embodied

in the record, and the proceeding is resubmitted for consideration and decision.

In other respects the above-entitled application is hereby continued to a time and place to be set.
