## OPINION AND ORDER

Applicants hold city and highway carrier permits. By Decision No. 46794 of February 26, 1952, in Application No. 33111, they were authorized to handle C.O.D. (collect on delivery) shipments for the 30th and San Pablo Furniture Warehouse Store without securing and filing a bond with the Commission as required by General Order No. 64C. This authority expired March 17, 1953. Applicants now seek its reinstatement. The shipper involved has again voluntarily waived the protection afforded by the C.O.D. bond requirements.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that reinstatement of relief from the bond
filing requirements for a further one-year period is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Paul Guercio and Frank Perry, doing business as Cottage Van and Storage, be and they are hereby authorized to handle C.O.D. shipments for the 30th and San Pablo Furniture Warehouse Store without providing and filing the bond required by General Order No. 84C; that this authority shall expire

one year after the effective date of this order, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission; and that in all other respects the rules and regulations set forth in General Order No. 84C shall govern the C.O.D. services involved in this proceeding.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
