In the Matter of the Application of CHARLES C. TOWLE, doing business as HIGHLAND-PATTON BUS LINE, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the following extension and alternative routes: I. An extension from Base Line and Osbun Road to the community of Del Rosa; II. An alternative route over Base Line Street between Waterman and Valencia Avenues; III. An alternative route route over Cypress Street and Palm Avenue in the community of Highland; IV. An alternative route over Sterling Avenue between Base Line and 9th Streets; V. An alternative route route over Valeria Drive between Base Line and 9th Streets.

OPINION

Applicant seeks authority to establish a passenger stage service into the Del Rosa area, situated northeasterly of San Bernardino, by extending its present certificated operations from the intersection of Baseline and Osbun Road along Baseline, Sterling Avenue, Highland Avenue, Golden Avenue, Lemon Street, Mountain Avenue, Los Flores Drive, Del Rosa Avenue to Highland Avenue.

Applicant now has operating rights from downtown San Bernardino along E Street and Baseline to Osbun Road.

As justification for the proposed service, applicant states that seven new subdivisions have recently been developed along the proposed new route; that there are about 1,200 new homes, making a total of approximately 2,000 homes in the area proposed to be served. A Commission engineer reports that the extension is justified on the basis of recent residential developments, and that the route chosen by applicant will, at this time, afford the best service to the most people.

Fares will conform with those now in effect. A new third zone is proposed north of Lemon Street. Current fares are two zones for 15 cents, with 5 cents for each additional zone.

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One more bus will be required for this line, which applicant has available. Service is proposed on an hourly basis. between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. On part of the line, west of Del Rosa Avenue and Baseline, the headway will be 30 minutes as the 9th Street leg of the route also operates along Baseline and E Streets. Applicant has a restriction prohibiting transportation of local passengers between the intersection of E and 4th Streets, and the intersection of Mountain View Avenue and Baseline, both inclusive.

In order to provide a more convenient bus service for school children, applicant also requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity for alternate routes, to be consolidated with portions of present certificated passenger stage rights, along the following streets:

- (a) along Baseline between Waterman Avenue and Valencia Avenue;
- (b) along Sterling Avenue between 9th Street and Baseline;
- (c) along Valeria Avenue between 9th Street and Baseline; and
- (d) beginning at Victoria Street and Typress Street, thence along Cypress Street, Palm Avenue, Pacific Avenue and Central Avenue to its intersection with Baseline.

Schools that will be served are Sturges Junior High on E Street, Highland Junior High at Central and Pacific Avenues, and Warm Springs grade school on Sterling Avenue.

It is also proposed to use Baseline between Waterman and Valencia for the new Del Rosa operation.

The application is not opposed.

Del Rosa Extension

Beginning at the intersection of Baseline and Osbun Road, thence along Baseline, Sterling Avenue, Highland Avenue, Golden Avenue, Lemon Street, Mountain Avenue, Los Flores Drive, Del Rosa Avenue, Highland Avenue, Sterling Avenue, Baseline to its intersection with Osbun Road.

Also along Baseline between Waterman Avenue and Valencia Avenue.

Also along Sterling Avenue between 9th Street and Baseline.

Also along Valoria Drive between 9th Street and Baseline.

Also beginning at the intersection of Cypress Street and Victoria Street, thence along Cypress Street, Palm Avenue, Pacific Avenue, Central Avenue, Baseline to its intersection with Palm Avenue.

Applicant is authorized to turn its motor vehicles at termini and intermediate points, in either direction, at intersections of streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersections, or in accordance with local traffic rules.

(3) That all of the restrictions and conditions now applicable to present certificated operations shall apply to the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Commissioners
