OPINION AND ORDER Applicants operate as a public utility warehouseman. By this application they seek authority to suspend service at one of their San Francisco warehouse locations. The floor space operated at this location aggregated 43,500 square feet. Applicants state that the lease they held on these premises has expired and that authority to suspend service is sought so that they may resume operations at such time as an appropriate lease for equivalent space can be secured. The Warehousemen's Association of the Port of San Francisco has advised the Commission that it does not object to the proposed suspension. The granting of temporary authority to suspend service is justified at this time. The suspension will be limited to a one-year period and made subject to such earlier cancellation, change or extension as circumstances may require. Applicants will be expected to make diligent efforts to acquire floor space equivalent to that covered by this suspension authority at the earliest possible date or to relinquish their operating rights to the extent of the amount of space involved. - 1 -

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that C. L. Tilden, Jr. and Irving S. Culver, partners, doing business as Gibraltar Warehouses, be and they are hereby authorized to suspend the operation of 43,500 square feet of warehouse floor space in San Francisco and that this authority shall expire one year after the effective date hereof unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
