OPINION AND ORDER

Charles R. Shupe, doing business as Shupe Warehouses, conducts public utility warehouse operations at Trigo and Gregg, Madera County. By this application he seeks authority to lease the warehouses to his son, Raymond C. Shupe, for a nominal consideration.

The application represents that due to his age the father wishes to have his son take over the operations involved. No change is proposed in the service available to the public nor in the rates, rules and regulations applicable thereto.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, that applicants' proposals are not adverse to the public interest and that the sought authority should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,



IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Charles R. Shupe, doing business as Shupe Warehouses, may, within sixty days after the effective date hereof, lease the warehouse property and equipment involved in this proceeding to Raymond C. Shupe and, due to the relationship of the parties, enter into an oral agreement covering the transaction involved; that prior to the effective date of said lease, Charles R. Shupe and Raymond C. Shupe, shall, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, supplement or reissue



tariffs on file with the Commission insofar as they name rates, rules and regulations governing the warehouse operations here involved to show that Charles R. Shupe has withdrawn or canceled and that Raymond C. Shupe has concurrently adopted or established as his own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs as set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
