## BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTIIITIES COMNSSION OF THE STATE OF CAIIFORNIA

In the Natter of the Application of , FIMEOLDT MOTOR STAGES, INC., and ELTON E. MATTOON, doing business HUNBOIDT TRANSPORTAIION CO., for authority (1) for the former to transfer, and the latter to acquire, certain operative rights and equipmont, and (2) for certificates of public convenience and necessity to oe issued to both applicants.

## OPINION

In the above-entitied appiication the Commission is'requested to authorize Eumbolet Motor Stares, Inc., to sell and Elton H. Nattoon to buy the following operative rights: (a) all of the nighway comon carmier operative rights now owned by the seller, which rights authorize service for the transportation of property between the junction of U. S. Highways 201 and 299 and Forks of Salmon ond intcrmediate points via Willow Creek and Orieans, and between those points on the onc hand, and, on the other hand, points on U.S. Fighway 201 from Scotia to Irinidad inclusive via Eureka and the Off-route points of Redwood Acres Finir Ground and Cranncil, (b) passenger stage operative rights authorizing the transportation of pascongers, baggaece and express between the function of U. S. Highways 101 and 209 and Forks of Salmon and intermediote points via willow Creek, Orleans and Somes Bar as restricted between.W1110w Creck and (1) せ. S. Einghway 101.

The buyer (Mattoon) also requests the Commission to 1ssue to him o certificate authorizing passenger stage operations between points aiong U. S. Highway 201 between its junction with U. S.

[^0]Highway 299 and Eureka, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points on U. C. Highway 299 between its junetion with ti. S. Highway 102 and Forks of Salmon subject to the local restriction above referred to.

This recuest is made in order to enable the buyer to hande passenger traffic between those points aiong U. S. Highway 101, on the one band, and points east of the junction of U. S. Highways 201 and 299 in order to place him in a position to conduct through service between such points similar to the service now provided by the seller. Since the through stages of the buyer will be passing through Blue Dake, it is asserted the prblic would be bencfited by permitting him to serve Blue Laise even though it is proposed that the seiler shall also conduct through service at that point in conjunction with the 2atter's service between Scotia and Trinidad.

The selicr (Humboldt Motor Stagos, Inc.) will retain its passenger stape operative rights between Scotia and Trinidad and intermediate points along U. S. Highwy 101 via Eureka, Bayside, Sunny Brae and ircata with off-route service to Redwood Acres Fair Ground and Cranncil. The seller also requests a passenger stage certificate between the junction of T. S. Highways 201 and 299, Blue Lake and Korbel and intermediate points so that it may continue cerving these points which are within a reiative short distance from U. S. Highway 2.01 . Such outhority would anable the seller to continue to provide the same service that it is presently rendering to and from Klue Laike and Korbel and points on U. S. Elahwey 201 between Trinidad and Scotia. Blue Lake is situated on U. S. Highway No. 299. Korbel lies southerly of that highway on a county rosd.

Appilcants also request the Commssion to issue new eertificates to each of them after authorization of the transfer and certification of the extensions sought, sald new certificates to supersede and be in the place and stead of all operative rights involved herein including those retained by the seller.

Authority is also sought by the seller to transfer to the buycr two passenger stages, two one-hajf ton pick-up trucks, one ilat-rack trailer and one tractor, a total of seven automotive units in adistion to miscellaneous separato parts for those Vehicles. According to the application the present depreciated value of this cquipment is $\$ 17,550$.

According to the agreement of sale, attached to the application os Fxhibit A, the purchase price is $\$ 20,000$ payable as follows: $\$ 5,000$ upon the transfer of the operative rights involved; $\$ 2,000$ on or before two yoars after the date of the trancfer of such operative rights and an additional sum of $\$ 2,000$ each year thereafter on the onniversary date of said transfer until the sum of $\$ 20,000$ is paid in full with interest thereon at the rate of 4 per cent per annum on the unpaid balance of the purchase price.

A balance shect statament (Exhibit E) indicates the net (2)
worth of the buycr as of April 1,2953 , to be $\$ 22,0+2$.

The application states that the selier presently maintains through routes and joint rates with Pacific Greyhound Lines appiying to service over the route of certain operative rights proposed to be trensforred. The seller under contract also acts as an uncieriying carrier for an express corporation. The buyer would continue these arrengoments.

The seiler asscrts that it is presentiy conducting operations under sll of its operative rights which it proposes to transfer to the buyor. Ifkewise it is providing service under all of the rights which it proposes to retain except thet it is not handing any traffic for Railway Express aroncy, Inc., under an exception contrined in its passenger stage certificate. Although such trafinc Is still moving the selier states it is presentiy handied by another carrier. It prefors to retoin this excoption in regard to Railway Express traffic to mect any possible future requests which might arise, but states that it has no objection to its elimination if the Commission concludes that should be done. Under the circumstances it appears that public convenience and necessity no longer require the special exception for the traffic of Railway Express Agency. Therefore, the exception should bc omitted from the new certificate requested by Humbolat Motor Stages.

The buyer proposes to adopt and to continue in effect the prosent farcs, rates, charges and sorvice.

As justification for the authority sought the appiication states that with the exception of the passenger stage operations to and from Blue Lake and Korbel the entire operations of the seller to, from and between points cast or U. S. Highwey 101 to and including the terminus of the operation at Forks of Salmon by reason of the noturo of the operation and the characteristics of the territory involved is in reality separata and distinct from the operations of
the seller along U. S. Highway 101. The buyer will thus be able to devote his full time and attention to those operations proposed to be acquired by him; that the buycr has had meny years experience as a driver for the selier and experience as an automotive shop forman; that the buycr would be able to do all mechanical work necossary to maintain the equipment proposed to be used and also engage in parttime driving thereby conducting the oporntion in the bost possibie. menner and thus likewise reducing expenses.

The Commssion after consideration of applicants' requests is of the opinion thet thoy should be granted and that a public hearing is not necessary. The commssion is of the further opinion and finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of new certificates to aech of the applicants, es sought which would be in lieu of all of the operative rights involved.

Elton H. Mattoon is hereby placed upon notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be copitailzed or used as an eioment of value in rate-fixing for any amount of money in excess of thet originally patd to the state as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from thes. purely permiesive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly fenture may be changed or destroycd at any time by the State, which is not in any respect inmited to tho number of rights which may be given.

An appilcation having been made to the Comission requesting nuthority io transfer operative rights and for certificates of public convenience and necessity, the matters having been considered and the Commision being of the opimion that the money, property or fabor to be procured or peid for by the execution of the agreement of
sale is reasonably required by the buyer for the purpose specificd herein, thorofore,

## IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Humboldt Motor Steges, Inc., may, after the effective date hereof and on or before August 31, 2953, sell and transfer to Elton H. Mattoon, and the latter may acquire the passenger stage and highway common cerrier operetive rights and property referred to in the opinion hercof, said sale to be made pursuant to the terms and conditions of the agreement of sale attached to the application hercin, which the parties may execute.
(2) That in the place and stead of the operative rights which Elton $H$. Mattoon is authorized by paragraph I of this order to acquire, the Comission hercby grants to said Elton H. Nattoon a new certificate of public convenience, and necessity authorizing service:
(a) As a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities code for the transportation of passengers, baggage and packages of express weighing 100 pounds each or less on passenger-carrying vahicies oniy, between the junction of J. S. Highways 101 and 299 and Forks of Saimon and intermediate points via $41110 w$ Creek, Onleens and Comes Ber, and between said points, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points on $U . S$. Highway 101 from Eureka to the junction of U. S. Highways 201 and 299 subject to the following restriction:
No passengers, baggoge or express shall be
transported to or from any point on U. S.
Highway 299 from the junction of said Highway
with U. S. Highwoy 101 to and including Willow
creck, except on passenger vehicios originating
at or destince to weitchpec or points beyond.
(b) as a highway comon carrier, as defined in

Section 213 of the Public Utilities code, for the transportation of property betweon the junction of U. S. Highwas 201 and 299 and Forks
of Salmon and intermediate points via Willow Creek and Orlcans, and betweer said points, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, pos.nts on U. S. Ëishway 101 from Scotia to Irinidad inclusive and serving Ruwood teres Fair Ground and Crannell by diversion from the main nighway.
(3) That in the piace and stead of the operative rights remaining in tumboldt Notor Scages, Inc., after the execution of the sale and transfer authorized in paragraph 1 of this order and created by Decision No. 41237 as modified by Decisions Nos. 41248 and 45621 a certificate of public convenience and nesessity is hereby granted to said Fumboldt Motor Stages, Inc., as a passuncer stage corporation, as defined in Scction 226 of the Pubile Utilitios Code, for the transportation of passenfers, bageage and packages of express weighing 100 pounds or less, on passenger-carrying vehicles only, between Scotia, Bureka, Bayside, Sunny Brac, Arcnta, Biuc Lake, Korbel, Cranneil, Frinidad and intermediate points, serving Redwood Acres Fuir Grounds by diversion from Sureka upon domand of 6 or more passengers.
(4) That the operative Fights created by Decision No. 41137, (Gpplication No. 28870), Decision No. 4248 (Application No. 28870) and Decision No. 45611 (Application No. 32167) are horeby revoked and annuiled.
(5) That upon the consumation of the transfer of the properties os herein nuthorized and in provieing service pursuont to the certificates herein granted, applicants sinil comply with and observe the followsing service reguiations:
(a) Applicants chall file written accoptences of the certificates herein granted on or before fugust 31, 1953.
(b) On or before August 31, 1953 and on not less than 2 days notice to the Commission and the public, applicants shall establish the services herein authorized and fie in triplicate and concurrently make effects.ve appropriate tariffs and timetables which shall be satisfactory to the commission.
(c) Subject to the authority of this commission to change or modify them by further order operation pursuant to the certificates herein granted shall be conducted as follows:

By Elton H. Mattoon over the following route:
Beginning at Eureka thence over U. S. Highway 101 to U. S. Highway 299 , thence over J. S. Highway 299, State Route 96 and a county road via willow Creek, Orleans, Some Bar to Forks of Salmon.

By Humboldt Motor Stages, Inc., over the following route:
Over U. S. Highway 101 between Scotia and Eureka. Between Eureka and Arcata over U. S. Highway 101 and about $2-1 / 2$ miles to wayside Junction, thence via Bayside Junction Road $2 / 2$ mile to the old Arcata-Eureka Road which is followed north into Arcana a distance of 3 miles via Bayside and Sunny Brae. Between Arcata and Trinidad vie U. S. Highway 101. Over county road between U. S. Highway 101 and Cranneil. Over U. S. Highway 299 and county road from junction U. S. Highway 201 to serve Blue Lake and Korbel.
(6) That the authority herein granted will become effecLive when min $H$. Matron shall have paid the minimum fee prescribed by Section 1904 of the prabife Utilities code, which fee is $\$ 25$. Dated at Xoformesicio, california; this 2.3 h day
