OPINION AND ORDER

The Commission by order dated June 24, 1953 instituted an investigation into the operations, practices and compliance with statutes and regulations applicable to the passenger stage operations of P. B. Hackley, Jr., for the purpose of determining whether any and all operative rights and certificates of public convenience and necessity heretofore issued should be revoked, cancelled or suspended.

P. B. Hackley, Jr., by writing dated July 2, 1953 advised the Commission that he has discontinued his passenger stage service and is not in a position to render good service to the public and requested that the certificates of public convenience and necessity possessed by him be revoked.

Good Cause Appearing Therefor,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the certificates of public convenience and necessity issued in Decisions Nos. 34293, 34761, 36382, 37895, 38623 and 43718, dated June 10, 1941, November 18, 1941, May 25, 1943, May 15, 1945, January 22, 1946 and January 17, 1950, respectively, are revoked and annulled.

(2) That all effective tariffs and time tables on file with the Commission in the name of P. B. Hackley, Jr. are cancelled as of the effective date hereof.

(3) That the investigation concerning P. B. Hackley, Jr. is discontinued and Case No. 5475 is dismissed.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
