O R D E R

The Stockton Port District is authorized to construct one additional spur track at grade across West Washington Street, San Joaquin County Road No. 716 near Port of Stockton, City of Stockton, San Joaquin County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 59-0.5. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding 2 per cent. Protection shall be by existing Standard No. 1A crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B). Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

The present "3 Tracks" signs on the posts of the existing Standard No. 1A crossing signs shall be revised to indicate "4 Tracks".

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The warehouse to be served by the proposed spur will need service within ten days, therefore the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
