ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

JOHN DREW MILLER, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that his telephone service at 1838-1/2 South Gramercy Place, Los Angeles, California, under number REpublic 36802, has been disconnected by defendant; that said communication facilities were not used with the knowledge or consent of complainant as an instrumentality to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation; and that complainant will suffer irreparable injury to his reputation and great hardship unless service is immediately restored; therefore

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainant pending a hearing on said complaint and further Commission order thereon. The complaint, assigned to Commissioner Huls, is set for hearing before said Commissioner or such Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served forthwith upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph

Company, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its answer to said complaint within ten (10) days after such service. The Secretary is directed further to cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant forthwith.
