SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum rates for the transportation of property in the Los Angeles drayage area are set forth in City Carriers' Tariff No. 4 - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 5. These rates are generally subject to the provisions of the Western Classification and of the Pacific Southcoast Freight Bureau Exception Sheet, but are not subject to all of the provisions of these publications. Rules of the classification and exception sheet which do not apply in connection with the minimum rates are listed by number in the minimum rate tariff. That tariff also makes reference to other provisions of the classification and exception sheet by using the numbers of the items in which the provisions are stated. The exception sheet has been reissued, effective September 25, 1953. Its provisions have been rearranged and its rules and items renumbered. The minimum rate tariff should be revised accordingly. Its listing of excepted classification rules should also be brought up to date.

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A public hearing is not necessary. Therefore, good cause appearing, CI 5435-EO

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that City Carriers' Tariff No. 4 -Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 5 (Appendix "A" to Decision No. 32504 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:
