ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across East Railroad Boulevard, in the City of Calexico, Imperial County, at the location described in the application. East Railroad Boulevard is not improved at the point of crossing, and this authority shall not be construed as authorizing the opening of said street across the track.

Applicant is also authorized to construct a spur track at grade across Grant Street, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. BN-708.1. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding four per cent. Protection of the spur track shall be by one additional Standard No. 1 crossing sign (General Order No. 75-B).

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within 30 days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant contends that the industry to be served by this track has declared that immediate track service will be required and has requested that the authority, if granted, be made effective immediately. For this reason the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
