## OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common carrier and highway contract carrier permits. By Decision No. 47281 of June 17, 1952, in Application No. 33452, he was authorized to handle C.O.D. (collect on delivery) shipments for Hercules Powder Company without securing and filing a bond with the Commission as required by General Order No. 84C. This authority expired July 7, 1953. Applicant seeks its reinstatement. The shipper involved has again voluntarily waived the protection afforded by the C.O.D. bond requirements.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that reinstatement of relief from the bond filing requirements for a further one-year period is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Wm. A. Murphy be and he is hereby authorized to handle C.O.D. shipments for Hercules Powder Company without providing and filing the bond required by General Order No. 84C; that this authority shall expire one year after the effective date of this order, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission; and that in all other respects the rules and regulations set forth in General Order

No. 84C shall govern the C.O.D. services involved in this proceeding.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
