ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Applicant is a highway common carrier. He seeks exemption from the bond filing requirements of General Order No. 84-C in connection with the handling of C.O.D. (collect on delivery) shipments.

The bond filing requirements were established as a protection for shippers using C.O.D. service. In certain instances contract carriers have been granted exemption from these requirements in connection with transportation for specified shippers. Such exemptions have been authorized only where the shippers involved have voluntarily waived the protection afforded by the general order. No general exemption has been granted.

Under General Order No. 84-C, carriers may elect whether or not they will provide C.O.D. service. With respect to those carriers choosing to provide that service for the public generally, shippers are entitled to the protection afforded by the bonding requirements. No general exemption has been shown to be justified in the case at hand. Applicant should file the required bond or, if he chooses, withdraw from C.O.D. service and publish in his tariff notice of that withdrawal. Such action is authorized under General Order No. 84-C.

In the circumstances, the application will be dismissed.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-entitled application be and it is hereby dismissed.
