ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By prior orders in this proceeding, applicants were authorized to transport cement in bulk from Permanente to the Port of Redwood City for Permanente Cement Company at a rate less than the established minimum rate. In Decision No. 48779, however, the Commission found that applicants' request in this supplemental application for authority to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further period of one year should not be granted without further investigation. To prevent a lapse of the authority in the meantime, the expiration date thereof was extended to September 22, 1953. Applicants since have informed the Commission "that it will not be the purpose of your applicants to seek further extension for this authority as such extension is no longer necessary." Meanwhile, the authority in question has expired. To clear the Commission's records, however, the supplemental application will be dismissed.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the sixth supplemental application of W. W. Miles and Pat L. Nolet, a partnership doing business as Miles and Sons Trucking Service, filed June 15, 1953, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby dismissed.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
