FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 49215, dated October 20, 1953, the Commission authorized Desert Hot Springs Water Co. to distribute its assets to its shareholders and authorized said shareholders to sell and transfer the properties comprising the water system now operated by Desert Hot Springs Water Co. to Desert Hot Springs County Water District. The Commission provided that the authorization granted will become effective 20 days after the date of the order.

The Commission now is informed that all parties to the transaction desire to effect the transfer of the properties on or about November 1, 1953. They have requested the Commission to make its supplemental order shortening the effective date so as to permit them to do so.

The Commission has considered this matter and is of the opinion that the request should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Ordering Paragraph 6 of the order in Decision No. 49215, dated October 20, 1953, reading as follows:

"6. The authority herein granted will become effective 20 days after the date hereof."
