ORDER REVOKING OPERATING RIGHTS

It appearing by Decision No. 47818, dated October 14, 1952, in Application No. 33728, that Goorgo Gardner, Trustoe in Bankruptcy of Edward P. Le Mour, doing business as Ed Le Mour Transportation Co., was authorized to sell, and Desert Petroleum Corporation, a California corporation, was authorized to purchase the operative right granted to Edward P. Le Meur, doing business as Ed Lo Mour Transportation Co., by Docision No. 44723, dated August 29, 1950, in Application No. 31373, as amonded, to ostablish and operate a service as a petroleum irregular route carrier for the transportation of petroleum, liquid asphalts, and hot road oils and other petroloum products, in tank trucks or tank trailers over any public highways botwoon all points and places within the State of California; it further appearing that no evidence of adequate protection against liability imposed by law for the payment of damages for personal injury or property damage is now on file with the Commission by said Desert Petroleum Corporation, as required by General Order No. 100; and it further appearing after investigation by this Commission that the above-described operation has been discontinued without any authorization to suspend or discontinue same; therefore, it is found that Desert Petroleum Corporation is no longor conducting and has unlawfully abandoned said potroleum

irregular route carrier service.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity transferred to Desert Petroleum Corporation, a California corporation, by Decision No. 47818 in the above-entitled proceeding, is hereby revoked.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within 30 days after the effective date of this order, on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission, all effective tariffs filed on behalf of Desert Petroleum Corporation shall be canceled.

The Socretary of the Commission is hereby directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon Desert Petroleum Corporation, a California corporation, in the manner prescribed by law.

The effective date of this order shall be the twentioth day after lawful service thereof upon Desert Petroleum Corporation, unless said Desert Petroleum Corporation before such effective date shall have filed with this Commission a written response to this order, denying the facts set forth herein and requesting a public hearing thereon, in which event the effective date of this order will thereby be stayed until hearing is held and further order issued.
