SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

American Home Foods, Inc., seeksinclusion of "spaghetti and cheese, with sauce, in combined boxes," in the commodity description provided for "Canned Goods and Other Articles" set forth in Item No. 610 series of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Lake at San Francisco on October 8, 1953.

The commodity here under consideration consists of an eightounce cardboard package of unprepared spaghetti, a 3/4-ounce can of
cheese and a 10-ounce can of sauce. All of the items are packed in a
single cardboard package. For shipping purposes twelve complete
packages are encased in a box. The shipping weight is 19 pounds.

This commodity is subject to the minimum class rates set forth in Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2. The class rates are governed

The commodity in issue is marketed under the trade name of Chef Boy-Ar-Dee Dinners. It will herein sometimes be referred to as "spaghetti dinners."

by the ratings specified in the Western Classification and certain exceptions thereto. For spaghetti and cheese with sauce the classification provides a fourth class rating in less carload quantities and a fifth class rating in quantities of 36,000 pounds or more. Under petitioner's proposal the spaghetti dinners would be subject to ratings of 90 percent of fourth class for less carload quantities and fifth class minimum weight 30,000 pounds for carload shipments. In addition the commodity would be subject to commodity rates applying between San Francisco and Los Angeles and between other specified points. The effect of the proposal is a reduction.

The sought classification ratings and commodity rates are those presently applicable to prepared spaghetti, macaroni or vermicelli with or without cheese, meat or vegetable ingredients and other foods which are now included in Item No. 610 series of the tariff.

Petitioner contends that because of the present rate differential which prevails between spaghetti dinners and other competitive food products an undue and unreasonable hardship prevails with respect to its shipments.

A traffic consultant retained by petitioner introduced an exhibit showing the weight per cubic foot and value per pound of the spaghetti dinners in comparison with various foods now included in Item No. 610.² According to this exhibit the density and value of the product here under consideration are 34.2 pounds per cubic foot and 21.7 cents per pound respectively. The density of the commodities with which the comparison was made range from 18 to 48 pounds per

The commodities with which the comparison was made are brown bread, ground chili, cocoanut, caviar, garlic chips, garlic powder, pimentos, welsh rarebit, prepared macaroni, egg yolk, beef stew, meat balls and spaghetti.

cubic foot with an average weight per cubic foot of 38.11 pounds. The value in cents per pound of the compared products ranges from 10.4 to 116.4 cents with an average value of 42.88 cents.

Exhibits were also introduced by the traffic consultant listing several motor carrier and rail line tariffs throughout the United States which include spaghetti dinners in canned or preserved foodstuffs list. In addition there was submitted a tabulation of less carload ratings, specified in various classifications having application throughout the United States for both rail and highway transportation of the petitioner's product and various other food products which are now included in Item No. 510 series. This exhibit shows that the classification ratings accorded the product here under consideration is subject to the same ratings or lower ratings than the other commodities.

Representatives of two highway carriers testified that petitioner's shipments of spaghetti dinners possess transportation characteristics as favorable as, or more favorable than, many of the canned goods which are subject to the ratings and rates here sought. They also stated that the density of the spaghetti dinners permits capacity loading of equipment and that the risk of handling was slight. The claim expense according to these witnesses was practically nil.

The assistant to the traffic manager of a large major shipper of canned goods testified that, while his company had no objection to the reduced ratings or rates here sought, it was opposed to the inclusion of the product in the canned goods item. He stated that the addition of spaghetti dinners in Item No. 510 series of the tariff would only tend to furnish grounds to include other items. It is to be noted however that the item in question includes a variety of articles other than canned goods.

Counsel for the Truck Owners Association stated that unnecessary and unwarranted making of exception ratings and establishment of commodity rates for articles now subject to class rates would tend to destroy the class rate structure and make necessary increased rates.

It has been shown that the transportation characteristics of petitioner's product are such that it should be grouped with canned goods and other articles for rate making purposes and that it should be accorded the same ratings and rates. The petition will be granted.

ORDER

Based on the evidence of record and on the conclusions and findings set forth in the preceding opinion,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective December 15, 1953, the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:

Tenth Revised Page 9 Cancels Ninth Revised Page 9. Tenth Revised Page 47 Cancels Ninth Revised Page 47.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that tariff publications to be made by common carrier respondents filed pursuant to this order may be made effective not earlier than December 15, 1953 and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

In all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
