OPINION AND ORDER

Mitchell Silliman Company, applicant herein, is a California corporation engaged in the public utility warehouse business in Salinas Valley and in certain other activities. In this application it seeks authorization to sell certain real property to the City of Salinas for the sum of \$1,500.

The application shows that the properties are not necessary in the operation of applicant's public utility business and that they are needed by the city for the crection of a municipal sewage pumping station.

We have considered this matter and are of the opinion that the transaction will not be adverse to the public interest. The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of the value of the properties herein authorized to be sold.

Upon the basis of the verified application we have concluded that a public hearing is not necessary in this matter and that the application should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

For the year 1952 applicant reported gross revenues of \$222,212.23 including storage revenues of \$88,139.48. It reported net profit of \$4,888.50.

- 1. Mitchell Silliman Company may sell to the City of Salinas the real property referred to in this proceeding.
- 2. The authority herein granted will become effective upon the date hereof.
