## EIGHTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized applicant to charge rates less than the established minimum rates in connection with the transportation of syrup and empty syrup containers for The Coca-Cola Company between certain specified points in northern and central California. The authority is scheduled to expire December 2, 1953. Permission is now sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period. Applicant proposes to observe rates generally higher than those previously authorized for this transportation and for certain split delivery shipments. In addition he proposes to transport pallets without charge.

The verified supplemental application shows that, except for increased operating costs, the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which justified deviation from the minimum rates generally still obtain. It also shows that the proposed increases in the authorized rates have been charged by applicant since April 1, 1953, with the exception of the 30,000-pound rate to San Jose which was increased November 1, 1953. These increases are said to have offset the higher operating costs. The sought rates, it is alleged, may reasonably be expected to be profitable during the ensuing year. In addition it is represented that the handling of the traffic on pallets materially reduces the time in loading and unloading and benefits the applicant.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought modification and extension of applicant's authority is justified and should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the authority granted John T. Lane by Decision No. 40914 of November 12, 1947, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby further amended by substituting the rates named in Appendix "A", attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, for those heretofore authorized for the transportation of syrup and for split delivery shipments from San Francisco to the points named in the appendix; that applicant be and he is hereby authorized to transport pallets without charge in connection with the transportation involved in this proceeding; and that the expiration date of the authority granted by said Decision No. 40914, as so further amended, be and it is hereby extended to December 2, 1954, unless sooner changed or extended by the Commission.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
