ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By complaint filed May 15, 1950, Meyers Ceramic Products Company, Paraffine Companies, Inc. and Sierra Talc and Clay Company sought reparation from Los Angeles Junction Railway Company, Southern Pacific Company and the Union Pacific Railroad Company in connection with carload shipments of talc or soapstone. Both complainants and defendants agreed to hold action on this complaint in abeyance pending the outcome of a similar complaint before the Interstate Commerce Commission. The complaint before the Interstate Commerce Commission and petitions for reopening and reconsideration thereof have been dismissed.

Complainants now request that Case No. 5200 be dismissed.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-entitled complaint be and it is hereby dismissed.
