FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 49184 applicants were required, among other things, to file "in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, appropriate tariffs and timetables within sixty days after the effective date hereof and upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public."

Applicants' attorneys have requested, in writing, a sixty day extension within which to comply with said provision. It is alleged that all other conditions of the order in said decision have been fulfilled; therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that paragraph (2) of the order in Decision No. 49184 be, and it is, hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) That applicants shall file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, appropriate tariffs and timetables within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof and upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
