On the 13th day of May, 1952, this Commission rendered Decision No. 47161 in the above-entitled proceedings wherein and whereby it ordered and directed Southern Pacific Company to take certain actions and perform certain acts. Thereafter, on the 17th day of June, 1952, the Commission rendered Decision No. 47276 in said proceedings modifying in certain respects said Decision No. 47161.

Southern Pacific Company sought review of said decisions before the Supreme Court of California and the Supreme Court of the United States. Pending the final determination of said review proceeding, the Commission stayed the operative effect of said decisions. Said review proceeding has been terminated resulting in the affirmance of said decisions.


Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that said decisions and each
