OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 43372, dated October 4, 1949, the Commission granted a passenger stage certificate to Asbury Rapid Transit System authorizing the transportation of passengers over certain routes within the City of Burbank and the community of North Hollywood. That certificate was granted for a temporary period, and on seven subsequent occasions has been extended. The last extension (Decision No. 48901, dated July 30, 1953) expires January 31, 1954.

Applicant's request (Seventh Supplemental Application No. 30638) to make permanent the authority granted by said Decision No. 43372 is now set for public hearing before the Commission. The instant application states that it is imperative that applicant's service be continued on a temporary basis until a decision on applicant's request for permanent authority is rendered by the Commission; otherwise the City of Burbank would have little or no local public passenger transportation service. The Commission is requested to extend the authority for the temporary service to and including June 30, 1954, thus avoiding any interruptions of service.

After full consideration of applicant's request we find that public convenience and necessity require that the service now

conducted by it pursuant to said Decision No. 43372 be continued on a temporary basis. A public hearing is not deemed necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the authority granted to Asbury Rapid Transit System by Decision No. 43372 in Application No. 30638 is hereby extended to and including June 30, 1954, subject to all the conditions contained in said Decision No. 43372.

(2) That applicant may deviate from the terms of the Commission's general orders necessary to file appropriate tariffs and timetables in triplicate satisfactory to the Commission. Said tariffs and timetables shall be filed on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public within thirty days after the effective date hereof and shall be made effective concurrently.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
