SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

Colgate-Palmolive Company seeks the inclusion of petroleum jelly, unmedicated or medicated only with carbolic acid, and medicated lipsticks (chap sticks), prepared and represented as a remedy, medicine or lubricant for the human body; and unmedicated glycerine in metal containers in boxes prepared and represented as a remedy, medicine or lubricant for the human body, in the commodity description provided for toilet preparations and other articles set forth in Item 395 series of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Lake at San Francisco on January 20, 1954.

The commodities here under consideration are subject to the minimum class rates set forth in Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2. The class rates are governed by ratings specified in the Western

Classification and by certain exceptions thereto. For these commodities the Western Classification provides a second class rating in less than carload quantities.

Petitioner proposes that this rating be reduced to third class when the value declared in writing by the shipper, or agreed upon in writing as the released value of the property, does not exceed 50 cents per pound. The sought classification rating is that presently applicable to toilet preparations and similar articles having a declared or agreed value not exceeding 50 cents per pound, which are now included in Item 395 series of the tariff.

Petitioner contends that, because of the present rate differential between the petroleum jelly and other articles here under consideration and the toilet preparations, an undue and unreasonable hardship prevails with respect to its shipments.

The assistant traffic manager of petitioner testified that the transportation characteristics of the two classes of commodities are similar. He introduced an exhibit showing the weight per cubic foot and value per pound of the petroleum jelly, the medicated lipsticks and unmedicated glycerine in comparison with various toilet preparations now included in Item 395. According to this exhibit the density and value of the products here under consideration average 37.6 pounds per cubic foot and \$.329 per pound, respectively. The density of the commodities with which the comparison was made ranges from 22.5 to 49.5 pounds per cubic foot, with an average weight per cubic foot of 34.3 pounds. The value per pound of the compared products ranges from \$.263 to \$1.838, with an average value of \$.782.

Evidence was also introduced by the assistant traffic manager showing that the articles here under consideration are accorded the same or lower ratings in various classifications and in various interstate tariffs than are accorded the other commodities. The witness further testified that no claim expense for damages had been encountered by his company's shipments during the last six-month period.

Counsel for the Motor Truck Association of Southern California participated in the development of the record through cross-examination of the witness but did not submit evidence. No one opposed the granting of the petition.

It has been shown by density, value, risk and other rate-making considerations that the transportation characteristics of petroleum jelly, unmedicated or medicated only with carbolic acid, medicated lipsticks (chap sticks) and unmedicated glycerine prepared and represented as a remedy, medicine or lubricant for the human body warrant the reduced ratings and rates. The petition will therefore be granted.

On consideration of all the facts and circumstances of record we are of the opinion and hereby find the proposed ratings have been justified.

O R D E R

Based on the evidence of record and on the conclusions and findings set forth in the preceding opinion,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective April 1, 1954, the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a

part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:
