Decision No. 49673

In the Matter of the Investigation into the rates, rules, regulations, charges, allowances and practices of all common carriers, highway carriers and city carriers relating to the transportation of general commodities (commodities for which rates are provided in Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2).

OPINION

By petition filed on December 21, 1953, Purex Corporation, Ltd., asks that the description of soap, lard and related articles, for which a truckload commodity rate is named in Item No. 730 series of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2, be broadened by the inclusion of "Bleach, Laundry, NOIBN, Dry, in Bags, Barrels or Boxes", and "Sodium (Soda), viz: Hypochlorite Solution."

A public hearing was held before Examiner Bryant at Los Angeles on February 2, 1954. The matter is ready for decision.

The aforesaid tariff item provides a minimum rate of 42 cents per 100 pounds, minimum weight 30,000 pounds, between San Francisco Territory and Sacramento Territory on the one hand and Los Angeles Territory on the other. It applies on various commodities specifically listed under a general heading of "Soap, Lard, and Related Articles."

The petitioner is engaged in the business of manufacturing, selling and distributing cleaning, scouring and washing compounds and related products. It has California plants in South Gate and San Leandro. A relatively new product, sold as a "dry bleach", consists of 8 percent calcium hypochlorite in combination with 92 percent of inert ingredients including 18 percent cleansing ingredients. The compound contains 8 percent available chlorine. Another principal product, sold as a "liquid household bleach", is described as "sodium (soda), viz: hypochlorite solution." These are the two products referred to in the present petition.

Petitioner's general traffic manager testified that in his opinion the two bleaches in question are already ratable under Item No. 730 series, but that some differences of opinion have developed. He said that in any event a tariff of the rail lines naming an identical carload rate between the areas in question specifically lists the two bleaches herein involved, and that this rate is available, therefore, to highway carriers

The commodities described in Item No. 730 series include "Compounds, Cleaning, Scouring or Washing", "Disinfectants, other than medicinal" and "Lime, Chlorinated (Chloride of Lime Bleach or Bleaching Powder)."

under an item in Highway Carriers! Tariff No. 2 which provides for the alternative application of common carrier rates (Item No. 200 series) . For these reasons, according to the witness, the proposal of his company would result in tariff clarification rather than in an actual change in rates and charges. He testified further that all of the commodity tariffs applying on traffic moving between points in the western states as published by common carriers, including both railroads and motor carriers, have been amended by addition of the commodities herein involved to the tariff items covering soap and related articles. He introduced exhibits showing the classification ratings on all of the commodities listed in Item No. 730 series and also on the two articles now proposed to be added thereto. In another exhibit he set forth the classification descriptions, size of pack, dimensions, cubic foot measurement and gross shipping weight of all products manufactured by Purex Corporation, Ltd. The comparisons show that the two bleaches are comparable with the other articles listed in Item No. 730 series insofar as weights and density per case are concerned.

No other witness testified. No one opposed the granting of the petition. However, a representative of the Commission rate staff stated that the manner in which the petitioner proposed to designate the articles in Item No. 730 series might be productive of varying interpretations. The staff representative suggested that the sought result might

best be accomplished by merely changing the present description "Compounds, Cleaning, Scouring or Washing" to read "Compounds, Bleaching, Cleaning, Scouring, Washing." The petitioner's general traffic manager concurred in the suggested modification.

The evidence is convincing that compounds intended primarily for bleaching purposes are comparable in their transportation characteristics with cleaning, scouring or washing compounds, and that provision should be made for the bleaching compounds in Item No. 730 series in order to remove any uncertainty in the application of the rate.

Upon careful consideration of all of the facts and circumstances of record it is concluded that Item No. 730 series of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 should be revised to the extent provided in the order which follows.

ORDER

Based upon the evidence of record and upon the conclusions and findings contained in the preceding opinion,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

(1) That Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606, as amended) be, and it is, hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective April 1, 1954, Eighteenth Revised Page 5 cancels Seventeenth Revised Page 5 and Sixteenth Revised Page 5, and Eighth Revised Page 64 cancels Seventh Revised Page 64, which revised pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

- (2) That tariff publications to be made by common carriers pursuant to this order may be made effective not earlier than April 1, 1954, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
- (3) That in all other respects the aforesaid Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
