SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

City Carriers' Tariff No. 6 - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 7 provides minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of rock, sand and other materials in dump trucks between designated production areas and delivery zones in Los Angeles and Orange Counties. Mileage and hourly rates are provided for movements between points not covered by the zoning arrangements. The mileage and hourly rates are generally higher than the zone rates. California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc., seeks extension of the zone rate system to cover deliveries from recently established production facilities of Consolidated Rock Products Co. located outside the present production areas.

Petitioner represents that the average monthly production will be several thousand tons of rock and sand and that a substantial amount of this material will be transported by for-hire dump trucks to nearby points. It states that the present rates are not practical. It claims that the establishment of zone rates from Consolidated's plant would be of benefit to carriers, shippers and the general public.

Interested parties have been notified of the filing of the petition. No one has opposed its being granted.

The proposed extension of the zone rate system is justified. The petition will be granted.

A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that City Carriers' Tariff No. 6 - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 32566 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:
