FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By the terms of the Commission's order in its Decision No. 45089, dated December 5, 1950, in the above-entitled proceeding, applicant, Southern Pacific Company, was required to protect traffic on Linden Avenue against all train movements over the proposed spur track crossing, described in the application.

By Resolution No. ET-680, the Commission on December 1, 1953 authorized the Southern Pacific Company to install, in lieu of existing protection, two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals supplemented with automatic crossing gates to be activated by and protect traffic against train movements on all tracks at Crossing No. E-10.2, the intersection of Linden Avenue and the Southern Pacific Company main line in South San Francisco, San Mateo County.

With a supplemental application in the above-entitled proceeding, filed on December 23, 1953, Southern Pacific Company now requests the Commission to modify its Decision No. 45089 by eliminating therefrom the aforementioned requirement concerning the flagging of traffic on Linden Avenue.

Good cause appearing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following paragraph from Decision No. 45089, reading as follows:

"Traffic on Linden Avenue shall be protected against all train movements on said track by a competent employee of applicant, acting as a flagman." is deleted upon the completion of installation and the operation for public use and travel of two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals supplemented with automatic crossing gates as authorized by Resolution No. ET-680.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing.

In all other respects Decision No. 45089 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
