FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds city and highway carrier permits. Decision No. 48265 of February 10, 1953 authorized him to handle C.O.D. (collect on delivery) shipments for Hub Furniture Company, Acorn Stove Company, Leonard Bern Company, San Pablo Furniture Mart and Joe Hyman without securing and filing a bond with the Commission as required by General Order No. 84C. This authority expired March 2, 1954. Applicant now seeks its reinstatement but with the substitution of Kane Furniture Company for Hub Furniture Company. The shippers involved have voluntarily waived the protection afforded by the C.O.D. bond requirements.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that reinstatement of relief from the bond filing requirements as proposed is justified. Because the conditions under which the C.O.D. service in question is performed may change at any time, the reinstatement will be limited to a one-year period and made subject to such earlier cancellation, change or extension as circumstances may require. So that applicant's exemption will not be inoperative for any appreciable length of time, the order herein will be made effective immediately.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Joseph Perry, doing business as Perry's Express, be and he is hereby authorized to handle C.O.D. shipments for Kane Furniture Company, Acorn Stove Company, Leonard

Bern Company, San Pablo Furniture Mart and Joe Hyman without providing and filing the bond required by General Order No. 84C; that this authority shall expire one year after the effective date of this order, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission; and that, in all other respects, the rules and regulations set forth in General Order No. 84C shall govern the C.O.D. services involved in this proceeding.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
