FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 48512 of April 21, 1953, C. L. Tilden, Jr. and Irving S. Culver, partners doing business as Gibraltar Warehouses, were authorized to suspend for one year the operation of 43,500 square feet of warehouse space in San Francisco. A one-year extension of this authority is sought.

Applicants allege that they have attempted to obtain suitable replacement space but will be unable to secure it prior to May 11, 1954, the expiration date of the present suspension authority.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought extension is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted C. L. Tilden, Jr. and Irving S. Culver, partners doing business as Gibraltar Warehouses, by Decision No. 48512 of April 21, 1953, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to May 11, 1955, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective May 11, 1954.
