FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 49733, dated March 2, 1954, the Commission authorized W. R. Swoape to transfer certain operative rights and properties to Rush Swoape Trucking Co., Inc. The order of the Commission provides for the withdrawal or cancellation of rates, rules and regulations by W. R. Swoape and the adoption or establishment of the same by Rush Swoape Trucking Co., Inc. within 60 days after the effective date of the Commission's order.

The Commission is informed that applicants have not yet received authorization from the Interstate Commerce Commission with respect to the transfer of interstate operative rights and that therefore the parties are not in a position to complete the transfer. Accordingly, they request an extension of time to meet the Commission's requirements.

The Commission has considered this matter and is of the opinion that an extension of time should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the time within which W. R. Swoape may withdraw or cancel his rates, rules and regulations and Rush Swoape Trucking Co., Inc. may adopt or establish the same, as authorized by Decision No. 49733, dated March 2, 1954, be, and it hereby is, extended to and including July 31, 1954.

This first supplemental order will become effective upon the date hereof.
