ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision No. 40680, dated September 10, 1947, in Application No. 28577, William F. Lenhart, Thomas L. Reese and Eugene Vigno, copartners doing business as Golden Gate Excursion Company, were granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the establishment and operation of service by vessel for the transportation of persons as a common carrier between the foot of Broadway in Oakland and the plant of United Engineering Company in Alameda.

It appears after investigation that the above-described operation was discontinued in 1950 without any authorization to suspend or discontinue the service. The vessel used in the service was repossessed by the bank. Lenhart, the active partner, died in 1953. The whereabouts of Reese and Vigno is unknown. In the circumstances it appears that the operation has been abandoned, that the certificate of public convenience and necessity should be revoked and that tariffs and timetables for the service involved should be canceled.

Therefore, good cause appearing,





IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to William F. Lenhart, Thomas L. Reese and Eugene Vigno, copartners doing business as Golden Gate Excursion Company, by Decision No. 40680, in the above-entitled

proceeding, is hereby revoked and all effective tariffs and timetables on file in the name of Golden Gate Excursion Company are hereby canceled.

The Secretary of the Commission is hereby directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon Thomas L. Reese, Eugene Vigno and the estate of William F. Lenhart in the manner prescribed by law.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after lawful service of copies thereof upon the above-named parties, unless said Thomas L. Reese, Eugene Vigno and the estate of William F. Lenhart before such effective date shall have filed with this Commission a written response to this order, denying the facts set forth herein and requesting a public hearing thereon, in which event the effective date of this order will be stayed until hearing is had and further order issued.
