ELEVENTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized applicant to deviate from the established minimum rates in connection with specified San Francisco drayage operations. The authority is scheduled to expire June 5, 1954. Permission is sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period. Applicant proposes to observe rates generally higher than those previously authorized, except in connection with the transportation of newsprint paper.

Applicant states that the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which have justified deviation from the minimum rates still obtain, that the increases proposed will offset higher operating costs and that in the case of the newsprint the rate is still compensatory because of greatly increased tonnage. Applicant further states that operations under the proposed rates will be profitable.

In the circumstances it appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the supplemental application should be granted. To prevent a lapse of applicant's authority, the order herein will be made effective June 5, 1954.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 47200 of May 27, 1952, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby further

amended by substituting for Appendix "A" thereof Appendix "A-1" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

IT IS HERNBY FURTHER ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by said Decision No. 47200, as further amended herein, be and it is hereby extended to June 5, 1955, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective June 5, 1954.
