In the Matter of the Investigation into the rates, rules, regulations, charges, allowances and practices of all common carriers, highway carriers and city carriers relating to the transportation of property in the City and County of San Francisco and the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Santa Clara, San Mateo, Marin, Monterey, Napa, Santa Cruz, San Benito, Solano and Sonoma.

OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 49886 dated April 6, 1954, in Case No. 4084, cancelled commodity rates in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A applicable to the transportation of new office furniture, such cancellation to become effective June 1, 1954. The cancellation was based on a record indicating that there was no movement under these rates and that their continuance appeared to be no longer warranted.

Roc Ross and Gil Gouveia, doing business as Re-Ly-On Van Service, have petitioned for rehearing of Decision No. 49886 in respect to the above-mentioned rates. Petitioners allege that they are not members of the Draymen's Association, that they had no knowledge of the proposal to cancel these rates and that they have been and are doing considerable business under these rates. The petitioners, therefore, ask that the rates be retained at the same level.

By order in Decision No. 49998, dated May 6, 1954, Case No. 4084 was discontinued. Matters formerly considered in that case are now

being considered in Case No. 5441. It appears that the petition for rehearing in Case No. 4084 should be denied but that the rates on new office furniture should be retained in the minimum rate tariff.


Therefore, good cause appearing,






