SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. <u>5011</u> Gentered today in Case 4808 establishes Minimum Rate Tariff No. 11-A, naming commodity rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of uncrated new furniture. These rates will supersede the class rates for this transportation contained in Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2. That tariff will be amended accordingly.

	MIXED SHIPMENTS	
	(1) 1. Commodities for which rates are provided in this tariff:	
	(a) When two or more commodities for which different ratings are provided, are shipped as a mixed shipment, without actual weights being furnished or obtained for the portions shipped under the separate ratings, charges for the entire shipment will be computed at the class or commodity rate applicable to the highest classed or rated commodity contained in such mixed shipment, sub- ject to Item No. 80 series.	
	(b) When two or more commodities are included in the same shipment and separate weights thereof are furnished or obtained, charges will be computed at the separate rates applicable to such commodities in straight shipments of the combined weight of the mixed shipment. The minimum weight shall be the highest pro- vided for any of the rates used in computing the charges, sub- ject to Item No. 80 series. In the event a lower charge results by considering such commodities as if they were divided into two or more separate shipments such lower charge shall apply.	
	(1) Paragraph 1 hereof will not apply to mixed shipments which are subject to the provisions of Item No. 365 series of this tariff.

Commodities for which rates are provided herein, moving in mixed shipments containing commodities for which rates are pro- vided in other effective tariffs of the Commission, or in mixed shipments containing commodities upon which no minimum rates or charges have been established by this Commission:	
	(a) When one or more commodities for which rates are not provided in this tariff are included in a shipment of one or more commodities for which rates are herein provided, the rate or rates applicable to the entire shipment may be determined as though all of the commodities were ratable under the provi- sions of this tariff; or one or more of the commodities for which rates are not provided in this tariff may be transported at the rates otherwise applicable. In the event the latter basis is used, the minimum charges provided in Item No. 150 series of this tariff shall apply to the entire shipment. (See Notes 1, 2, 3 and $l_{4,2}$)	artol
