O R D E R

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct State Route 196 at grade across the Escondido Branch of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company at Vista, San Diego County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 2E-9.4. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties, and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Width of each of the two roadways shall be not less than 36 feet and grades of approach not greater than four per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by three Standard No. 8 flashing light signals and one Standard No. 1-A crossing sign (General Order No. 75-B).

Within 30 days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
