O R D E R

County of Modoc is authorized to construct County Road #111 at grade across the Fernley-Klamath Falls Line of Southern Pacific Company near Homestead (Stronghold), Modoc County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. CFA-525.3. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than twenty-four feet and grades of approach not greater than one percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs reflectorized with reflex-reflecting material. (G.O. No. 75-B).

The Southern Pacific Line crosses the line of the Great Northern Railway at Stronghold. The construction of the proposed crossing of County Road #111 over the Southern Pacific line will make unnecessary the retention of Crossing No. 9-31.4 which is that of the same County Road #111 over the Great Northern. Therefore, upon completion, Great Northern Railway Company's Crossing No. 9-31.4 about one-fourth mile southerly shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
