ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By petition filed February 26, 1954, Al Blasi sought a one-year extension of authority to maintain a rate on lumber less than the minimum rate otherwise applicable from Willits to San Francisco and Oakland. The lesser rate was scheduled to expire March 9, 1954. Decision No. 49778 of March 9, 1954, granted him authority to publish the sought rate for a 60-day period. The temporary extension was granted because petitioner's allegations were not fully persuasive that the authority should be granted for the full period sought and there was not sufficient time to develop the facts essential to dispose of the matter before the applicant's lower rate would have expired.

Petitioner has been asked to supply additional information concerning this operation. He has not furnished this information. Apparently he does not wish to pursue the matter.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, except to the extent granted by Decision No. 49778, Petition No. 27 in Case No. 5432 be and it is hereby dismissed for want of prosecution.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
