O P I N I O N

Applicant, Key System Transit Lines, presently rendering a service for the transportation of passengers between and in the various communities of the East Bay Area as well as between said Area and the City and County of San Francisco, requests authority to extend its service to a newly constructed area known as Washington Manor.

Said extension of 5.4 miles has been requested by the residents of Washington Manor and has the approval of the San Leandro City Council.

After considering the matter the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being fully informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is heroby granted to Key System Transit Lines authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code for the

transportation of passengers as follows:

From the intersection of Hesperian Blvd. and Paseo Grande in San Lorenzo Village, via Paseo Grande, via Alamitos and Washington Avenue, West Avenue 152nd, Farnsworth Street, Purdue Street, Wiley Street, Spruce Avenue, Merced Street, 1st Avenue, to the intersection of 1st Avenue and Washington Avenue, in the City of San Leandro.

(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within thirty days after the effective date hereof.
- (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public applicant shall file in triplicate and concurrently make effective, appropriate tariffs and timetables.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
