No change in routes, schedules, or fares is contemplated.

The application is not opposed, and under the facts and circumstances of record the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the proposed transfer and sale is not adverse to the public interest. The application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of value of the property authorized to be transferred.

O R D E R

Application having been made, the Commission being fully advised in the premises and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Gurneo Munn, Jr., may sell and transfer, on or before October 31, 1954, to Los Angeles-Trona Stages, Inc., a corporation, the operating rights and property hereinabove described, upon the terms and conditions set forth in the application, and Los Angeles-Trona Stages, Inc., is authorized to acquire such rights and property and continue to operate said transportation service as heretofore authorized by this Commission.

(2) That in the event said sale and transfer is consummated Los Angeles-Trona Stages, Inc., shall notify the Commission in writing of the fact within thirty days after the date of transfer.

(3) That applicants shall, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, amend the tariffs on file with the Commission in so far as they name rates, rules and regulations governing the operations here involved to show that

Gurnee Munn, Jr., has withdrawn or canceled and that Los Angeles-Trona Stages, Inc., has concurrently adopted or established as its own said rates, rules and regulations.

(4) That the authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised on or before October 31, 1954.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
