OPINION AND ORDER

At the public hearing held on August 2, 1954, before
 Examiner Mark V. Chiesa, evidence having been adduced, this matter
 was submitted for decision subject to the filing, at applicant's
 request, of an amendment to the original application for a ware-
 house certificate of public convenience and necessity whereby
 (1) the commodity to be stored would be restricted to new furniture
 only, and (2) the rates, charges, rules and regulations proposed
 would be the same as in Warehouse Tariff No. 7-C, issued by Jack
 L. Dawson, agent, Cal. P.U.C. No. 102, now on file with this
 Commission.

On August 14, 1954 applicant's attorney addressed a
 letter to this Commission requesting that the application be
 dismissed without prejudice because applicant company, after

further investigation, found that it could not operate under the provisions of said tariff.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the application of California Pool Car Distributors, Inc., a corporation, being Application No. 35403, be, and it hereby is, dismissed without prejudice.
