ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By petition filed July 20, 1954, complainants sought suspension and investigation of certain rates for the transportation of property between San Francisco and South San Francisco which were filed on behalf of various highway carriers by the Pacific Motor Tariff Bureau. Assertedly, the rates were unreasonably low.

The Pacific Motor Tariff Bureau has since cancelled the assailed rates and in their stead has established rates which are not less than those recently prescribed as minimum for the transportation involved (Decision NO. 50432, dated August 17, 1954, in Case No. 5432). Complainants now request dismissal of their petition.

Therefore, good cause appearing,
