In the Matter of the Application of D. J. Glardon, operating under the duly established name of HARBOR TRANSFER CO., for permission to Charge Less than Established Rates for Transporting Flour.

Application No. 27945 (Eighth Supplemental)

EIGHTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant was authorized to deviate from the established MiNIMUM FALOS IN CONNECTION With the transportation of flour in truckload lots within the City of San Diego. The authority is scheduled to expire October 29, 1954. Permission is sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period.

The supplemental application alleges that, except for increased wage costs, the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which justified deviation from the minimum rates generally still obtain and that the higher wages have been offset by the use of more efficient mechanical means of unloading. It also alleges that operations under the authorized rates have been profitable and may reasonably be expected to continue to be profitable during the ensuing year. To prevent a lapse of applicant's authority, the order will be made effective October 29, 1954.

Applicant also shows that the fictitious name of Arrow Transfer has been changed to Harbor Transfer Co.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 39572 of October 24, 1946. as amended, be and it is hereby further amended by substituting in the ordering paragraph thereof "Harbor Transfer Co."

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for "Arrow Transfer," and that the expiration date of the authority as so amended be and it is hereby extended to October 29, 1955, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective October 29, 1954. Dated at San Francisco, California, this <u>19</u> day of October, 1954.

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
