O R D E R

By this application, Pacific Greyhound Lines has requested an order authorizing the installation of "exempt signs" at Crossings Nos. AE-150.4-C and AE-150.6-C, the intersections of U.S. 99-W (State Highway Route #7) with tracks of Southern Pacific Company near the City of Willows, Glenn County.

It appears that said tracks are industrial tracks as indicated in Section 576(d) of the Vehicle Code. The railroad and the State of California, Department of Public Works, have no objection to this application. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that approval is hereby granted for the display of distinctive "exempt signs" (Vehicle Code Sec. 576(d)) at the indicated grade crossings.

Such signs shall comply with Section 16.05 of General Order No. 98 and shall be erected and maintained by the proper authorities. If any sign is removed or the view thereof obstructed, vehicles carrying passengers for hire must come to a full and complete stop before passing over the crossing. Within thirty days after erection of such signs applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing.

This approval does not exempt any vehicle operator from the observance of any provision of the Vehicle Code and shall lapse if signs are not displayed within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Approval may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

This order shall be effective immediately.
