SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized applicant to deviate from the established minimum rates in connection with the transportation of syrup and empty syrup containers for The Coca-Cola Company between certain specified points in southern California. The authority is scheduled to expire February 7, 1955. Permission is now sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period. Applicant proposes to observe higher split delivery charges than those previously authorized and to add Pomona as a destination point.

Pomona is intermediate to points now regularly served. The supplemental application shows that, except for increased operating costs, the conditions which justified deviation from the minimum rates generally still obtain. It shows also that the higher operating costs are offset by the proposed increases in the split delivery charges together with reduced insurance costs, greater volume of traffic and improved operating efficiency. Applicant declares that the sought rates may reasonably be expected to be profitable during the ensuing year.

In the circumstances it appears that the proposed rates are reasonable. This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The supplemental application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the authority granted Export Forwarders, Inc., by Decision No. 42423 of January 18, 1949, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby further amended by substituting for Appendix "A-3" thereof Appendix "A-4" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof; and that the expiration date of the authority granted by said Decision No. 42423, as so further amended, be and it is hereby extended to February 7, 1956, unless sooner changed or further extended by the Commission.

This order shall become effective February 7, 1955.
