OPINION AND ORDER

Floyd W. Rail conducts public utility warehouse operations at Murrieta (Riverside County). The property is leased from A. Z. Howard and B. H. Barnett. By this application Rail proposes to withdraw from the warehouse business and Ernest E. Fisk seeks authority to assume the lease on the property.

The application shows that Rail lives in Fallbrook (San Diego County) and desires to center his activities there. It also shows that Fisk has been employed by Rail for the past two years and desires to take over the operation. No change is proposed in the service available to the public nor in the rates, rules and regulations applicable thereto.

In the circumstances it appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, that applicants' proposal is not adverse to the public interest and that the sought authority should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Floyd W. Rail is authorized to assign to Ernest E. Fisk a lease agreement with A. Z. Howard and B. H. Barnett for the warehouse property and equipment involved.


IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that, within sixty days after the effective date hereof, applicants shall, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or re-issue the tariffs on file with the Commission insofar as they name rates, rules and regulations governing the warehouse operations here involved to show that Floyd W. Rail has withdrawn or canceled and that Ernest E. Fisk has concurrently adopted or established as his own said rates, rules and regulations. In all other respects said tariff filings shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.


This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
