FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION By Decision No. 51001 in this application a certificate covering the San Francisco-East Bay Cartage Zone was granted to this carrior. Applicant had requested in its original application that Niles be included in his cortificate. This part of his request did not receive consideration in Decision No. 51001 owing to the fact that the Commission's attention was then directed toward the numerous applications under consideration within the Cartago Zono. On March 8, 1955, we granted further hearing to consider the inclusion of Nilos. That hearing took place on March 21 and the matter was resubmitted and is ready for decision. Matters of finance, facilities, personnel and experience were discussed in Decision No. 51001 and the discussion will not be repeated here. Since the prior hearing a 1935 and a 1936 semitrailer and a 1944 pole dolly have been retired from the revenue fleet and -1-

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The area here sought is a small one geographically. The distance from Hayward (nearest city limit) to Decote is less than one mile; from Decote on to Niles, more than 2½ miles further. Applicant testified that his father and he had served this area for about thirty years. They began, the witness stated, serving a clay products concern at Niles. Most of their present shipments are from or to two steel companies in the area. An electric firm in Centerville, a contractor and one or two others have been served. Shipments have averaged about eight per menth. Weight per shipment is frequently in the truckload or greater range.

It appears that applicant has served this area for a long time. It appears also, that his holding out has been very broad. The limitations in the variety of commodities carried result from the economic characteristics of the area rather than from any costriction of applicant's holding out. The Commission, therefore, is of the opinion and finds that the sought authority should be granted.

ORDER

Application having been filed and public hearings held thereon, and the Commission having considered the same and being of the opinion and finding that public convenience and necessity so require, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That ordering paragraph No. 1 of Decision No. 51001 in this application is hereby amended by adding thereto the following language:
