O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across County Road No. 12½ East at Borden, Madera County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. B-186.6. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the road now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding four percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G.O. No. 75-B), reflectorized with reflex-reflecting sheet material. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

No railroad train, motor, engine or car shall be allowed to stand on either the existing side track or the proposed spur track within a distance of seventy-five (75) feet from the nearest edge of said county road. An appropriate sign indicating this restricted use of these tracks shall be installed by the applicant at appropriate locations on each side of said crossing.

Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
