TWELFTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized applicant to deviate from the established minimum rates in connection with specified San Francisco drayage operations. The authority is scheduled to expire June 5, 1955.¹ Extension of the authority for a further one-year period is now sought.

According to the verified supplemental application, the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which justified deviation from the minimum rates still obtain. The application states that the operations under the authority have been profitable and are expected to continue to provide a profit satisfactory to the applicant.

In the circumstances it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates and charges are reasonable and consistent with the public interest. This is a matter in which a public hearing is not deemed necessary. The supplemental application will be granted. To prevent a lapse of applicant's authority, the order will be made effective June 5, 1955.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company by Decision
