## <u>opinio</u>

Leonard C. McCurdy is a highway carrier engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued him by this Commission.

He seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of farm and agricultural products, commodities and related supplies from fields, warehouses, packing sheds to docks, warehouses, farms, sheds, and wholesale and retail outlets within the borders of California or within a radius of 300 miles of Bakersfield.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personnel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation as herein authorized. A public hearing is not necessary.

Applicant is hereby placed upon notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may

The Commission having considered the application and representations filed herein, Now Therefore

IT IS ORDERED:

number of rights which may be given.

- (1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Leonard C. McCurdy, authorizing him to operate as a highway common carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as more particularly set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- (2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
  - (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance
    of the certificate herein granted. By accepting
    the certificate of public convenience and
    necessity herein granted, applicant is placed
    upon notice that he will be required, among
    other things, to file annual reports of his
    operations and to comply with and observe the
    safety rules and other regulations of the
    Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure
    to file such reports, in such form and at such
    time as the Commission may direct, or to comply
    with and observe the provisions of General Order
    No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the
    operating authority granted by this decision.

(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and upon not less than five days notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

## APPENDIX A

Leonard C. McCurdy, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the above-numbered decision, is authorized to transport vegetables, fresh or green (not cold pack or frozen), including mushrooms, fresh, between Shafter, Wasco and Bakersfield, and points within a 15-mile radius of Bakersfield, on the one hand, and Los Angeles, on the other hand. Such authority does not include the right to render service from, to or between intermediate points.
